Academic Rank: Assistant Professor (tenure track). Exceptional candidate may be considered at a

higher rank.

Starting Salary: \$46,000 and up. The University College also provides generous benefits.

Application

Deadline: January 15, 2007, or when filled.

Starting Date: July 1, 2007.

Institutional Requirement:

To be considered for appointment, any candidate must wholeheartedly endorse the <u>Mission Statement</u> and the <u>Statement of Faith</u> of the University College (see back). Candidates are also expected to be engaged in an ongoing effort to articulate and develop Christian perspectives on their discipline, addressing the role that faith has in shaping their research and teaching practice. The successful candidate must have graduate level course work in areas of teaching. A Ph.D. is required for tenure track appointment.

Teaching Load: 6 term courses per year (adjusted for labs or seminars). Responsibility for

Environmental Studies program may reduce teaching load.

Research Duties: All tenure track faculty members are expected to do research and publish results.

Professional Duties:

All tenure track faculty members serve the community in various ways out of their

expertise and share in faculty administration.

Particulars of the Position:

This position is based in the Social Sciences Division but has teaching and administration responsibility for an interdisciplinary Environmental Studies program. The successful candidate must be able to teach introductory Human and Physical Geography, and two or more of the following: Geographic

Information Systems, Environmental Science, Environmental Impact assessment

or Resource/Environmental Management. Experience in developing or

administering an Environmental Studies program, including student internships, is preferred. Team-teaching and international experience are assets. All geography

and environmental courses integrate faith and learning that emphasizes

foundational and ethical perspectives. Candidates are expected to articulate and develop a Christian perspective on their discipline, addressing the role that faith

has in shaping course content and research activities.

The King's University College is a Christian liberal arts university college offering three and four-year Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees, a Bachelor of Commerce, a Bachelor of Music, and a two-year after-degree Bachelor of Education (Elementary) accredited by the province of Alberta.
